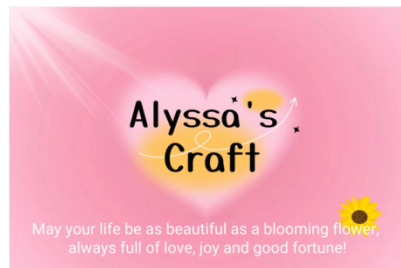

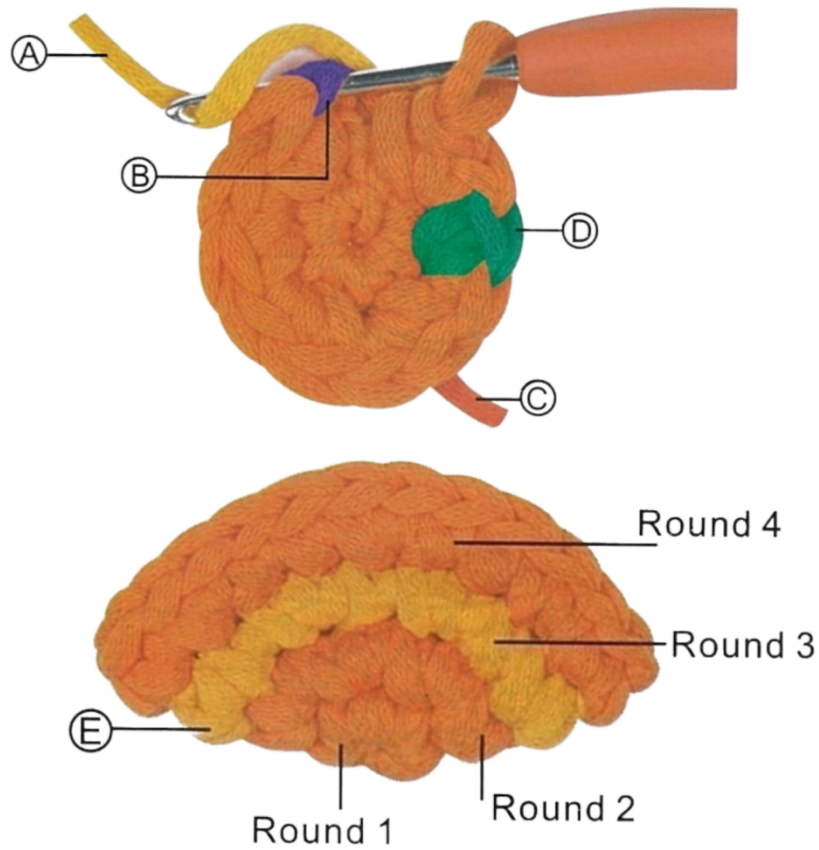

## Part 3 ▶

### Terminology



- |                                |  |
|--------------------------------|--|
| <b>A</b> Working yarn          | Yarn connected to the ball of yarn.  |
| <b>B</b> Top loops of a stitch | Where you usually insert the hook, to start the next stitch.                                     |
| <b>C</b> Yarn tail(end)        | End of yarn not connected to the ball of yarn.   |
| <b>D</b> Single crochet stitch | The main stitch used in amigurumi.   |
| <b>E</b> Round                 | A series of crochet stitches in a circle.<br>This illustrated crochet piece is made of 4 rounds. |

### Materials:

Yarn, Crochet hook, Stitch markers, Yarn needle

### Abbreviations:

ch - chain stitch

sc - single crochet

dc - double crochet

ss/sl, st - slip stitch

Rnd(s) - round(s)

sk - skip

yo/yoh - yarn over/yarn over hook

FLO - Front Loops Only

BLO - Back Loops Only

(,,)\*n = work all instructions in the brackets as many times as directed.

[,,] = work all instructions in square brackets into the same stitch.

○ chain stitch(ch)

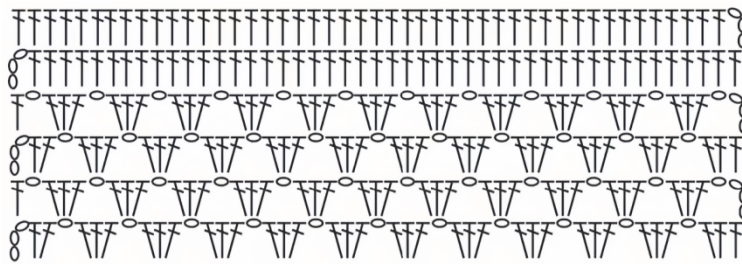
⌣ double crochet(dc)

## Tips:

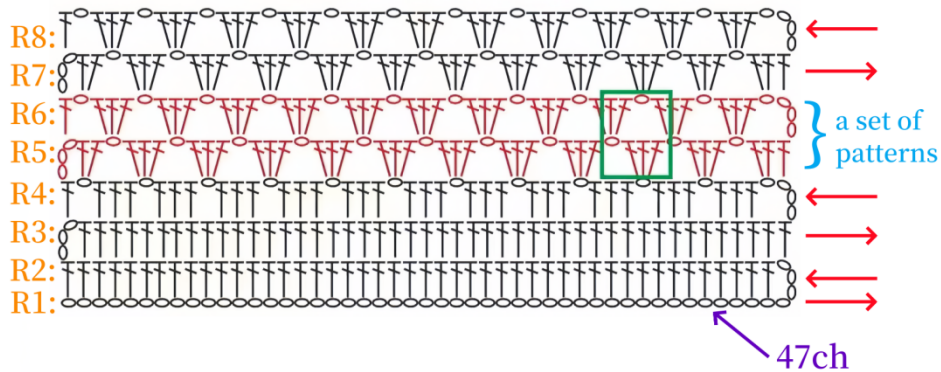
1: The length of the scarf can be adjusted by increasing the number of rows according to your own needs.

2: The number of starting stitches is a multiple of 3 + 2 stitches. The number of starting stitches in the diagram is 47 stitches.

3: After finishing each row, turn the fabric and continue crocheting.

## Scarf

**Rnd 1:** Slip knot, work 47ch (place a marker in the 46th back bump)



**Rnd 2:** Work 3ch (count as 1 dc). Place a marker in the 3rd ch. Crochet a double crochet (dc) in the back bumps of the 46th stitch, and then work dc of each back bumps one by one.



**Rnd 3:** Work 3ch (place a marker in the 3rd ch)  
Turn the fabric.  
Then work dc of each stitch one by one.



**Rnd 4:** Work 4ch (place a marker in the 3rd ch)  
Turn the fabric.  
Skip 2 stitches, work 3dc, 1ch. (Work 3dc, 1ch as one set, repeat this set until you finished)  
Finally, crochet a dc at the place of the marker.  
Each dc corresponds to 1 stitch, and each ch corresponds to 1 stitch.



**Rnd 5:** Work 3ch(Place a marker in the 3rd ch) **Count as 1 dc.**

Turn the fabric.

2dc in the hole,1ch;3dc in the hole,1ch.

work 3dc,1ch as one set,repeat this set until you finished this round.



**Rnd 6:** Work 4ch(Place a marker in the 3rd ch)

Turn the fabric.

Skip 1 stitches,work 3dc in the hole,1ch

Work 3dc,1ch as one set,repeat this set until you finished this round

Finally,work a dc at the place of the marker.



Repeat the crocheting methods of the 5th and 6th rounds, you can decide the length of the scarf according to your own needs.The remaining part will be completed by yourself.





## End

Finally,work 3ch(Place a marker in the 3rd ch) **Count as 1 dc.**

**Turn the fabric.**

And we work 1dc in each stitches, until you finished this round.



Work 3ch(Place a marker in the 3rd ch) **Count as 1 dc.**

**Turn the fabric.**

And we work 1dc in each stitches, until you finished this round.



Fasten off,leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.  
Use a yarn needle to conceal the yarn tail.



Finally,you will get  
beautiful scarf.
